

Taking Control in the Mirrorless Era

with all the new advancements in digital darkroom



There have been so many changes in cameras and the digital darkroom processes in the past few years – what do those mean to those of us who venture out into nature with cameras? The good news is that now, more than ever before, photographers have the opportunity to take control of both the in-camera design and exposure issues and the follow up actions in the digital darkroom. The even better news is that it's much easier to be in control than to fix up an image taken with all those “helpful” tools built in the camera (and the digital darkroom).

This workshop is designed to help you make natural and realistic images that reflect what you find in nature. It is not focused on using special effects, AI, or HDR to create images that don't exist in the real world. We'll show you how to build exposures and finish the process in the digital darkroom to bring out the best of the situations you find in nature.

Day 1 will focus on taking the complexity out of photography and understanding how to build exposures that fit the photographers' design intentions. We'll also work hard at "seeing light" – and understanding how both direct and soft light play into your options and ultimate image design.

Day 2 will see us out in Loess Bluffs National Wildlife Refuge – which should have high counts of both migratory birds and bald eagles. We'll practice what we learned on the first day.

Day 3 sees us back in the classroom – turning our field photography into images ready to be seen. We'll be hands-on with you, demonstrating with our images and yours, how to take your field results the final distance to the image you imagined as you were designing with the camera.
